Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ!

As I write this, we are only two sermons away from finishing the series through the book of Philippians that I began shortly after becoming your pastor. As we close out this epistle of Paul, I would like to take the opportunity to review some of the major themes we saw throughout the book. It is my prayer that these truths have taken root in your heart and you have considered how they might apply to your life individually, as well as our life as a church body.

The Gospel- As Paul opens the letter, he expresses thankfulness to the church in Philippi for their gospel partnership (Phil. 1:5). He tells these believers that his imprisonment has served to advance the gospel (Phil. 1:12). He encourages them to live their lives in a manner worthy of the gospel (Phil. 1:27). Do you share the gospel? Does your life reflect the gospel? How can you apply this gospel emphasis to your life?

Christ- Paul opens by reminding these saints that they are "in Christ" (Phil. 1:1). He reminds them of the day of Christ (Phil. 1:6, 1:10, 2:16). He knows that if he dies he will be with Christ, but if he lives he will continue to live for Christ (Phil. 1:22). He presents the incarnation and crucifixion of Christ as the ultimate example of humility (Phil. 2:5-10). He says that to know Christ is of surpassing worth, and everything else is rubbish in comparison (Phil. 3:8). Is your total trust in Christ? Do you value knowing him above all else? Are you living for him?

Joy- Throughout this letter, Paul speaks of his own joy. He prays for these believers with joy (Phil. 1:4). He rejoices at the proclamation of Christ (Phil. 1:18). He rejoices even as he is poured out for the sake of this church (Phil. 2:17). He calls these believers his joy (Phil. 4:1). He also speaks of their joy. He encourages them to receive Epaphroditus back with joy (Phil. 2:29). And he instructs them to rejoice several times (Phil. 2:18, 3:1, 4:4). Do you rejoice no matter the circumstances? Do you find joy in the Lord? Do you find joy in God's people?

Suffering- Paul tells these Philippian Christians that it had been granted to them that they should suffer for the sake of Christ (Phil. 1:29). He considers sharing in the sufferings of Christ part of truly knowing him (Phil. 3:10). He describes his contentment even in the midst of suffering (Phil. 4:11-13). Are you willing to suffer for the cause of Christ? Do you consider suffering for Christ a gift from God? Do you endure suffering with the mindset of identifying with Christ through it? Have you learned contentment in the midst of suffering?

Unity- Paul's main concern for the church at Philippi seems to be that they would maintain unity in the midst of persecution and pressure from the outside world. He wants them to stand firm in one spirit and one mind (Phil. 1:27). He instructs them on how to do this, teaching them to adopt an attitude of humility and selflessness (Phil. 2:3-4). He even addresses two women in particular that don't seem to be getting along, urging them to agree in the Lord (Phil. 4:2). Do you treat others with humility and selflessness, or do you look out for your own interests? Do you interact with the body of Christ in a way that promotes unity?

These are some of the main themes in Philippians. You may have identified others as we have gone through this sermon series. I would love to hear from you if the Lord has used a particular concept, verse, or passage from this great book of the Bible to convict you, encourage you, or transform you. Let us, as a church body, apply these great truths to our lives and rejoice as we see the Lord work in us and through us.


restored beauty and rich sound of our organ. I look forward to sharing this momentous occasion with you. Please mark your calendars and stay tuned for the official invitation and further details.






Jennifer Tedder Booth

Financial FYI

Each Monday, the Counting Committee meets to count the receipts from Sunday. They remove checks and cash from the offering envelopes verifying the amount given with the amount on the envelope. They also indicate the check number or show if it was a cash contribution. If a check comes in without an envelope, they will make one. They count the coins, currency, and checks and note on a worksheet the amount given for each gift (budget, television, Capital Needs, mission offering, memorials, etc.). The receipts are deposited in the bank.

DID YOU KNOW that you can just write one check? If you are wanting to assign your funds to different items, there is no need to write separate checks. You just need to write one check and then make sure to mark amounts you wish to contribute to the correct items on your envelope. The instructions on the envelope will be followed.
