Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ.

As I write this, we have two Sunday evenings left in our 8-week series looking at "The Bible's Big Picture." We have been tracing the overarching narrative of Scripture, looking at how each section and book of the Bible fits together to tell one story. For those of you who have been coming to that, I hope that it has been beneficial for you. I thought it would be helpful to use this article to briefly summarize what we have covered so far in that setting.

The Story Begins- God created everything perfectly good, including man and woman, who he made in His image and placed in the Garden. They had perfect fellowship with Him, and were a part of His kingdom- His people in His place under His rule experiencing His blessing. This was lost when they sinned. The curse of death entered creation, and fellowship with God was broken. But God promised a "seed of the woman" who would "crush the head" of the serpent, reversing the curse, redeeming man, and reestablishing the kingdom.

God Establishes a Nation- After flooding the world as an act of judgement, but saving Noah and his family, God chooses Abraham, his son Isaac, and his son Jacob and establishes a covenant with them. He would create His people from their descendants, establish them in His place, rule over them and bless them. From this people would come that "seed of the woman." This chosen family grew into the promised people, the Israelites, in the land of Egypt.

Deliverance, Law, and Conquest- The Israelites find themselves enslaved to Pharaoh and the Egyptians until the Lord raises up Moses to lead them out of Egypt. He then gives them the Law to live by, solidifying them as His people under His rule. The following generation, under Joshua's leadership, enters the promised land, but fails to drive the pagan nations out completely. In the land, they have no king, and continuously turn from God to worship idols. They are God's people in God's place, but not submitting to God's rule or experiencing God's blessing.

The Kingdom Rises and Falls- When the Israelites demand a king, God first gives them Saul, but then anoints David. God makes a covenant with David, that from Him would come an eternal king. But as a judgment on David due to his sin with Bathsheba, the kingdom splits into two- the Northern Kingdom of Israel and the Southern Kingdom of Judah. Israel goes through bad king after bad king, and Judah has many bad kings as well, with only a handful of good ones who honor God. Eventually, both kingdoms fall to pagan nations- first Israel to the Assyrians, then Judah to the Babylonians. The Lord preserves a remnant of Judah, who goes into exile. Some are able to return and rebuild Jerusalem and the temple, but they are still under pagan rule.

Prophets, Poetry, and Praise- During the times of the kings, the exile, and the return, God continually sent prophets to deliver His Word to the people. The message of the prophets consisted of calls to repentance, warnings of coming judgment, reminders of God's promises, and message of future hope and grace. They also predicted more about the coming Messiah, that promised Davidic king who was also the promised seed of the woman. God also gave the people books of wisdom and praise to help them live and worship as His people.

This is the story of the Old Testament. At the end is a sense of anticipation- the perfect kingdom of God has not been restored, man has not been redeemed, and the promised seed of the woman has still not come. But everything in the Old Testament points forward to that promised redemption and restoration, and the New Testament reveals that it is found in Jesus Christ. This is what we will explore during the last two weeks of the series.
